Mary Jane Patterson was the oldest of Henry Irving Patterson and Emeline Eliza (Taylor) Patterson's children. The Pattersons settled in Oberlin, Ohio, in 1856. Mary Jane Patterson not only was the first black woman in the United States to earn a college degree, she did it by spurning the usual courses for women at Oberlin, and taking instead a program of Greek, Latin, and higher mathematics designed for 'gentlemen .



Coleman Alexander Young (May 24, 1918 – November 29, 1997) was an American politician who served as mayor of Detroit, Michigan, from 1974 to 1994. Young was the first African-American mayor of Detroit. Young had emerged from the far-left element in Detroit, and moderated somewhat after his election as mayor. He called an ideological truce and gained widespread support from the city's business leaders.



Cardinal Wilton Daniel Gregory is an American prelate of the Catholic Church who is the archbishop of Washington. Pope Francis elevated him to the rank of cardinal on November 28, 2020. He is the first African-American cardinal of the Catholic Church. Before becoming archbishop of Washington, Gregory served as archbishop of the Atlanta, GA.



Rosalind G. Brewer, also known as "Roz", is an American businesswoman serving as the CEO of Walgreens Boots Alliance. With her appointment at Walgreens in March 2021, she is one of only two Black women CEOs of Fortune 500 companies. Brewer is the first African American woman to become: CEO of Walgreens Boots Alliance, group president and COO of Starbucks, and CEO of Sam's Club.



...Lent is Coming! We invite all of you to join us for either of our Masses on Wednesday, March 2nd. at 12 noon or 6 p.m. The 6 p.m. Mass will also livestreamed. **Notice: this Ash Wednesday will be different than past ones. Ashes will be places on your forehead with a cotton ball instead of with the priest's finger (there will be a separate cotton ball for each person receiving ashes). This is an effort to deter the spread of COVID-19**

Why Wednesday?

Ash Wednesday is the first day of Lent. The early church determined that the Lenten period of fasting and renewal should correspond to Christ's fasting (Matt. 4:2), and by counting forty days back from Easter (excluding Sundays, which remain "feast" days), arrived at the Wednesday seven weeks before Easter.

At one time Lent was primarily viewed as a period during which converts prepared for baptism on Easter Sunday, but later the season became a general time of penitence and renewal for all Christians. And Ash Wednesday became the day that marked the beginning of the Lenten renewal.

...FREE Tax Help. Families and individuals with incomes up to \$57,000 may be eligible for free tax help with the Accounting Aid Society. If you pay rent, heating bills or property taxes and are not working but have other income, you may also still be eligible for some tax credits, such as a heat credit and a property tax credit.
