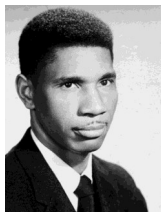
**Mary Antona Ebo, FSM**, (born **Elizabeth Louise "Betty Lou" Ebo**) was an American nun, hospital administrator, and civil rights activist. She marched with Martin Luther King Jr. in Selma in 1965, saying "I'm here because I'm a Negro, a nun, a Catholic, and because I want to bear witness." In 1967, she was named executive director of St. Clare's Hospital in Baraboo, Wisconsin, the first African-American woman to be head of an American Catholic hospital.



**Mamie Till-Mobley** was an American educator and activist. She was the mother of Emmett Till, who was murdered in Mississippi on August 28, 1955, aged 14, after being wrongfully accused of whistling at a white woman named Carolyn Bryant, a cashier at a grocery store. Today many credit her for starting the original Black Lives Matter movement when she decided: "I wanted the world to see what they did to my boy," sheading national attention to black death in America.



**Marian Anderson** was an American contralto. Anderson was an important figure in the struggle for African-American artists to overcome racial prejudice in the United States during the mid-twentieth century. In 1939 the Daughters of the American Revolution (DAR) refused to allow Anderson to sing to an integrated audience in Constitution Hall in Washington, D.C. With the aid of First Lady Eleanor Roosevelt and her husband President Franklin D. Roosevelt, Anderson performed a critically acclaimed open-air concert on Easter Sunday, April 9, 1939, on the Lincoln Memorial steps in the capital. She sang before an integrated crowd of more than 75,000 people and a radio audience in the millions.



**Medgar Wiley Evers** was an American civil rights activist and the NAACP's first field secretary in Mississippi who was assassinated by a white supremacist. Evers was engaged in efforts to overturn segregation at the University of Mississippi, end the segregation of public facilities, and expand opportunities for African Americans including the enforcement of voting rights. After Brown v Board of Education, Evers challenged the segregation of the state-supported public University of Mississippi, applying to law school there. He also worked for voting rights, economic opportunity, access to public facilities, and other changes in the segregated society. Evers was awarded the 1963 NAACP Spingarn Medal.
